Food Security and Sustainability: Exploring the Malaysian and Japanese youth participation in Agriculture.

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Exploring the Malaysian and Japanese Youth participation in Agriculture

This project explored both Malaysian and Japanese Youth participation in agriculture. In Malaysia, the finding of the research revealed that majority of the participants claimed that they involved in agriculture to primarily earn their living and also to fulfill their passion towards agriculture. Another emerging theme include family support which had been providing them better understanding of their roles and responsibility while family coaching helped them to significantly improve their knowledge through experiences, attitudes and skills. Most participants agreed that they have to work hard in order to get a desirable income or target from their agriculture activities. Therefore, economics factor in term of good income generation is another pivotal factor for them to strive for the best.

In Japan, all participants shared that their main reason to be involved in agriculture is to sustain their livelihood and also something that they are passionate about. The family support and the socioeconomic factors also play important roles as ways to earn income and support their family. Another factor such as family tradition and working environment gave significant impact for them to be in the industry. If the current youth farmers can prove themselves to be successful in the agricultural industry, more youth will be attracted to participate and dwell in the industry.

However there are barriers and challenges faced by the participants in Malaysia and Japan. They have to deal with high production and operating cost such as expensive machinery and technologies. The participants also claimed that they are vulnerable in dealing with natural risk such as flood, typhoon, climate change, diseases and pest, something which are beyond their control. Based on the finding above, it can be asserted that psychological factor also plays a pivotal role to sustain the involvement of youth farmers in agricultural environment. In this context, farmer's motivation was induced by both internal factor; passion, family tradition and socioeconomic and external factor; family support, working environment and through mentoring and coaching. All participants highlighted that these small factors affecting the way they perceive, think or behave toward agricultural sector hence, making them to entice in agricultural business environment. The finding would become an instrument to map a comparison between those who are, or interested to involve in agriculture with those who are not in the industry while providing government and private sectors a glimpse of ideas to formulate an action plan to engage these youths to get involves in agriculture. There are some resolutions as follows:

1. Agricultural extension programs should expose the successful youth agropreneurs as success stories to attract and strengthen the confidence of youth to engage in the industry.

2. The extension officers/educator should be trained with social skills on how to influence and persuade people, in addition to technical knowledge on how to attract more youth using technology in cordial environment.

3. The government should emphasize more on formulating the development policies and financial credit facilities which are in favor for youth farmers located in rural areas.

4. Youth should equip themselves with adequate knowledge by participating in any available agricultural development program to create awareness as well as improving their agricultural production.
