COMPLETION REPORT

A Study on Diversifying Japanese Trading Commodities in the Netherlands East Indies (1868-1942)

One of the aime of this studies is the continuation of research previous by studies on Japanese economic expansion and the Japanese migrations into Netherlands East Indies (NEI). Such as studies done by Howard Dick (1987), Yano (1977), Astuti (2009; 2011), Hayase (2014), Post (1991), Goto (1987) and Murai (1987) and recently done by the writer in 2017. Through this research, there were significant publications have been written. First, an undergraduate thesis supervised under by the recipient, written by: Desy Ratnasari titled (in Indonesia); Komodifikasi Perdagangan Komoditas Jepang di Surabaya (1890-1942), The Commodification and Trading of Japanese Commodities in Surabaya (1890-1942). Date in in September 2019. Secondly, there is a chapter under a book titled, History of Medicine in the Dutch East Indies and Indonesia: Current Trends and New Directions this project is on going project and will be completed in the end of 2020.

This research project succesfully identified, observed and analyzed the diversification of Japanese commodities in the NEI especially in Semarang, Surabaya and other parts of Sulawesi, particularly in Makassar. It started in the 1890s (or earlier) and ran to the end of toko Jepang era, in the beginning of 1942.

This study also succesfully compiled some refresh data and informations regarding Japanese commodities and also its brands that sold in the NEI. Some brands or service, such as Tansan, Sakura Beer, Bicycles, some patent medicine, such as tjap Timbangan (distributed by Kaneko Yoko), Tjap Kipas distributed by R. Ogawa Company, or the O.S.K (Osaka Shipping Kabushikigaisha) have been consumed/used by Indonesian (indigenous) people and inhabitants. Tansan Mineral Water was one of a significant commodity which at the beginning produced in Takarazuka, Kobe and later on produced by Asahi Beverage Manufacture. This product also exhibited in Semarang's Colonial Exchibition, 1914 and won an award as an excellent product. Another new invention that one of O.S.K ship, Toyen Maru was one of Japanese ships which took a part of 1918 Spanished pandemic by spreading the virus from abroad. One interesting part of this study, that some commodities are still exist and sold in diferrent kind product both in contemporary Indonesian/Japanese markets. Therefore, this project's research, can be used for emphasizing, one the concepts of social history of "Change and Continuity," in the history Japan-Indonesia focused of economic relations and the globalization on Japanese products/economic penetration.

According to Indonesian Higher Education database, there are 35 Indonesian universities which have Japanese Studies Program. One of main problems of the development on Japanese Studies in Indonesia is the lack of original/genuine text books and references, especially created by Indonesian historians/academics. Therefore, the result of this project is not only merely will be useful for the development of the study on Japan-Indonesia relations history, but this research project, hopefully, will be useful for teaching material on Japanese Modern History. In addition, this research project also analyzes how did Meiji Restoration give a significant impact to the economic history of South East Asia, as a whole, and NEI/Indonesia in particular. Through this project, some seminar have been conducted, including in Japan's university such as in Keio Fujisawa Campus, Tokyo, Hiroshima University, Rikkyo University. In Indonesia the dissemination of this project have been done in Hasanuddin University, Jember University, Airlangga University, LIPI, University of Indonesia, and ASJI Conference in Jakarta 2019.

I believed that, this research project gave an impact and also contribution on the development Japanese studies by producing a "fresh" and brand new on new perspectives of Japanese studies references in Indonesia, and elsewhere.
