The Community Based Development of Rice Straw Craft in Japan: Experiences and Development Pattern Learned for Rice Farming Community in Indonesia (study case Klaten Regency)

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Research Activities

This research aims to understand the approach of rice straw organizations in Japan in developing their events as a foundation of creating a rice straw community in Indonesia. In achieving the data, we visited several established rice straw organizations such as Inagaki Wara no Kai in Aomori Prefecture, Warashibe in Yokohama city, and Mingikai in Kawasaki city. To understand the Japanese rice straw culture, we visited Misato Town History and Folklore Museum in Akita Prefecture. In these locations, we interviewed both leaders and members of straw organizations, as well as joined the workshops for making of rice straw crafts.

Findings

We conclude that there are 2 focuses on their activities: preservation and development. As preservation activities of traditional artefacts, organizations create workshops and craft-making demonstrations. While developments of rice straw culture, activities create a new festival, straw contemporary arts, new products based on traditional crafts, and an event in collaboration with University.

Rice straw organizations have simple management structures, such as president, vice president, secretary, accounting, public relations, and members, in which the relation between organization members are based on strong kinship. In terms of organization category, since occasionally they are receiving profit, they are positioning themselves between NPO and profit organization. The external role is very important in supporting straw organizations, for example, local government facilitates the office, event area and provides operational funds for cultural preservation activities.

Rice straw is an important material to be considered by organizations, however, it is almost impossible to see rice straw because recently farmers are harvesting rice using machinery tools. To solve this problem, Inagaki Wara no Kai performs self-cultivating rice to produce their ideal straw. Meanwhile, Warashibe and Mingikai which located in the city purchase straw from craft materials suppliers.

Results

From the strategy of organizations mentioned above, there are values produced from their activities: economy, environment, culture, creativity, and happiness. This resulted a sustainable event performed each year. These organizations also participated mostly by the local community both as members or event participants. For the young generation, it becomes a new experience, while for the elderly the event brings a memory about meaningful life with nature in the past.

Recommendation

A highly motivated person in straw crafts is important to a pioneering straw organization in Indonesia. In the first phase, the initiator should learn in-depth the straw production methods and cultural potencies to strengthen the references in running the organization. Besides establishing a close relationship with local stakeholders, cooperation with external elements also needs to be established to support organizations related to the facility, economy, and research.

Action Required for the Future

To expand the activities at the village level, we have made a commitment to cooperate with local and external elements to create a farming culture-based festival with activities such as rice straw and traditional farming workshop and art performance which will be held in Klaten Regency during the harvesting time at the end of the year 2020.
