Subject of Research Project: Building for The Muse - A Historical Study of Japanese Designed Architecture for Arts in China

This research, 'Building for the Muse – a historical study of Japanese designed architecture for arts in China' studies Japanese designed cultural buildings in China since the early 1990s. Architecture for arts includes museum, gallery and theater which facilitate the artistic works and performances. Extremely elaborated in design, they usually become landmarks of the city and people's pride. They, in some extent, influence the city image, people's life, cultural exchange and the property development in the districts they are located. Such buildings will possibly emerge when economy reaches a reasonable height. When China gradually picked up in economy, wave of cultural constructions was rising. This research plans to record and investigate several prominent cultural buildings in Chinese cities designed by Japanese design masters.

I have traveled to several cities and investigated those prominent masterpieces designed by Japanese architects. These cases include Poly Theater in Shanghai, designed by Tadao Ando in 2014; Pearl Art Gallery by Tadao Ando in 2018; Shanghai Symphony Orchestra Concert Hall, designed by Isozaki Arata in 2013; Himalaya Center designed by Isozaki Arata in 2010; Liangzhu Cultural Center in Hangzhou designed by Tadao Ando in 2015; Wa Art Museum in Guangzhou designed by Tadao Ando in 2020; Library and Concert Hall in Shenzhen, designed by Isozaki Arata in 2008; Dadu Museum in Beijing, designed by Tadao Ando in 2014; Art Gallery, Central Academy of Fine Arts in Beijing, designed by Isozaki Arata in 2008.

To make comparative study, I visited mural exhibition, Asashi Beer museum in Osaka, Big Budha Head (頭大佛) in Hokkaido, all designed by Tadao Ando. These examples are threaded into a timeline, mainly woven by Tadao Ando and Isozaki Arata (1931-2022). They are my main study objectives. I have studied the publications about these master architects, their works in China and Japan, and the meaning of their architecture to Chinese society and professionals.

My research is written into articles. Some articles are published, some are under review by other journals.
